What is happening in RoPP?

Our committee met with mayor Dick Gross and councillors Bernadene Voss, Tim Baxter and Andrew Bond on 3 December. The purpose of the meeting was to share our concerns about the high cost of council rates and establish whether the council members are open to working with us to reduce rates and council spending.

We are pleased to report that our meeting was productive and the councillors acknowledged that rates are a very important issue and they have agreed to meet with us once a month during 2019 to work on a plan to reduce rates and spending. Our goal is to bring Port Phillip spending into line with our neighbouring councils of Bayside, Glen Eira and Stonnington as a starting position. We are hopeful of a constructive and collaborative relationship and we will evaluate the success of this initiative by evidence of a meaningful rate reduction for the 2019-20 financial year.

Council wage hike exposed

We have been given an interesting newspaper article from the Herald Sun (13 May 2018 - see below) that exposes a massive blowout in wages costs for councils across Victoria. Port

Phillip Council is no exception as it has budgeted wages expenditure of \$95.6 million for the 2018-19 year which represents a 9% increase over the prior year wages of \$87.8 million. The CoPP has budgeted to pay the salaries of 875 full time equivalents in 2018-19. The article recognises that 'at a time of stagnant wage growth, when ordinary Victorians are tightening their belt, the extravagant increase in labour expenditure warrants greater examination'.

This article reflects the views of RoPP and we whole heartedly agree with the following two comments in the article:

"Councils are increasingly populated by activists with delusions of grandeur who spend ratepayers' resources to grandstand on issues of national and international significance, issues that have little to do with local government business"

"Long-suffering ratepayers would appreciate councillors refocus on core council business that affect the daily lives of Victorians including the traditional three Rs of local government: rubbish, roads and rates".
